DENTISTRY AND THE MEDICAL SCHEMES ENVIRONMENT

The Council for Medical Schemes (CMS) Annual Report 2024/25 has been released, outlining key regulatory developments and performance indicators affecting healthcare providers and beneficiaries. This bulletin summarises issues relevant to the dental profession and private practice environment.

Regulatory Landscape & Policy Directions

National Health Insurance (NHI)

CMS reconfirmed its role in supporting the transition to NHI, with emphasis on:

- Defining complementary cover for schemes under NHI.
- Aligning private funding with national health priorities.
- Strengthening primary healthcare and prevention-based models.

What this means for dentists:

Private dental practices should anticipate future structural changes in benefit design, contracting frameworks, and reimbursement mechanisms under NHI. SADA continues engagement with policymakers to advocate for the sustainability of private dentistry and access to oral healthcare.

Medical Scheme Performance Industry Snapshot

- 71 registered medical schemes
- 9.13 million beneficiaries
- Solvency ratio 43.45% (above the statutory minimum of 25%)
- Relevant healthcare expenditure up 8.70%
- Contribution increases above CPI approved for 2024–2025 to protect reserves.

- Expect stricter scheme utilisation controls & clinical motivation requirements
- Continued pressure on tariff increases and reimbursement rates
- Intensified cost-containment measures affecting pre-authorisations & audits

Fraud, Waste & Abuse (FWA) Updates

CMS is finalising an expanded FWA Charter, including:

- Standardised industry protocols
- Proposed Tribunal for dispute adjudication
- Broader definitions to include error-related billing disputes.

SADA strongly supports fair, transparent, and evidence-based processes and will continue engaging to protect members, especially considering dentist-specific audit cases.

Clinical Policy & Benefit Developments Primary Care & PMB Review

CMS continues to review:

- · Prescribed Minimum Benefits (PMB) structure
- Base benefit package design with a focus on prevention

SADA is advocating for:

- Formal recognition of oral diseases as key NCDs
- Preventive dental interventions within the primary healthcare strategy
- Appropriate PMB inclusion and coding for dental emergencies and infection management

Digital & Data-Driven Health

CMS is investing in real-time data capture and improved digital infrastructure. This aligns with trends toward:

- Real-time claims analytics
- · Value-based care frameworks
- Telehealth integration, where clinically appropriate

Dentists should begin strengthening:

- Data compliance
- Clinical coding accuracy
- Reporting integrity
- Secure practice management systems

Practice Guidance for Members

SADA recommends practitioners ensure:

- Detailed clinical notes for all treatments
- ICD-10 and tariff coding accuracy
- Written consent and treatment plans
- Transparency in quoting & billing
- Secure digital records & compliance policies

SADA remains committed to:

- · Representing dentists in CMS and NHI processes
- Assisting members with scheme disputes
- · Advocating for funding of essential oral health services
- Promoting fair contract conditions & reimbursement
